STAR WHEEL

HOW TO USE:

1. Go outside on a clear night. A red flashlight will help you preserve your night vision.
2. Align the date and time.
3. Keeping the date and time aligned, turn the entire Star Wheel so that the "Facing..." label matches the direction you're looking.
4. The stars in the sky should match those on your wheel. Stars near the edges of the oval will lie near the horizon. Stars in the center of the oval are high overhead. Look for bright stars (bigger dots) first.
5. If you see a bright, steadily shining "star" on or near the curved line (the *ecliptic*), but it's not marked on your wheel - that's a planet!
